There is ONE drop; if you miss an assignment for any reason it will be considered your drop. Quizzes will be very quick to answer (but will require that you have read the chapter). ADDITIONAL STUDY MATERIALS:

When you access WileyPlus, you will find an assignment titled “136B study questions” which has no points and no due date; these are problems you can practice with and use WileyPlus features to research answers (and in fact see the answers). Additionally, the course webpage has prior quarter exams posted with solutions.

EXAMS:

The format of the exams may include multiple-choice, short-answer, exercise or problem type questions. You should pay close attention to the topics covered in lecture and for homework. Use your textbook to reinforce topics covered. The final exam will be cumulative containing approximately 75% untested material and a cumulative portion which will comprise approximately 25% of the total exam points.

There are NO make-up exams allowed. Please ensure that your schedule allows for attending all exams.

For the midterms and final you will need the following:

- Basic Calculator. NOTE, only a basic or financial calculator will be allowed. Please do NOT plan to take exams using a programmable calculator.
