INFORMATION TO NOTE:

-**ECON 1** may be taken during fall quarter, but it is recommended that *Calculus I* be taken first

-The **WRIT** course may be taken before or after declaring the full major

-**Complete “Change of Major” paperwork in NH2121** during the quarter you are taking the final pre/prep for major course (typically ECON 10A)

-The Economics major requires **7 upper division electives**. Major electives can be broken down as follows:

- 1.) **All** electives from **Area D**
OR
- 2.) **Up to 1** elective may be chosen from Area E and the rest from **Area D**

Economics 189 and 199RA do not count towards the major.
